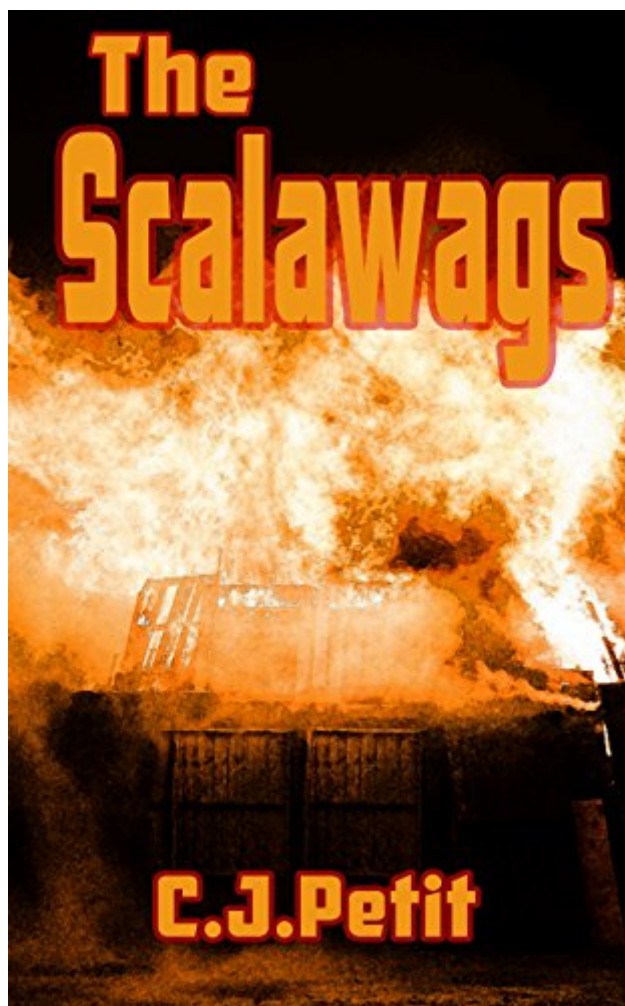

Built to house 400 prisoners this Confederate prison now holds 4,000. As with all the prisons both North & South, conditions are deplorable. When Sam was finally released in August of 1865 he will have to honor his promise to Joe. This story is about Sam's promise kept & the events that will change his life forever. If you enjoy a good western with a beautiful love story mixed in, you will like this book. As with all C.J.
