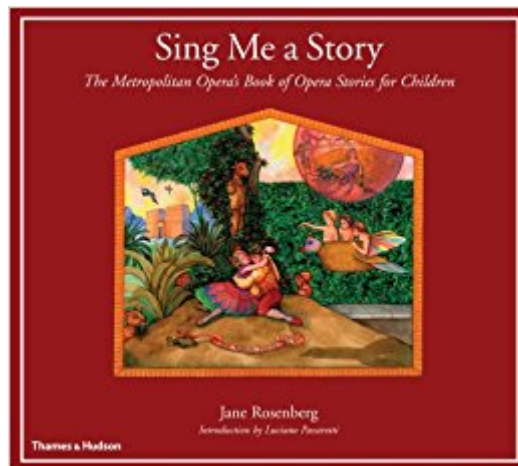




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Sing Me A Story: The Metropolitan Opera's Book Of Opera Stories For Children

Similar in style to Rosenberg’s earlier work on ballet, *Dance Me a Story*, this engaging volume of opera stories is sponsored by the Metropolitan Opera Guild. The text and illustrations exude the glamour, passion and lyricism of opera, from Luciano Pavarotti’s playful introduction--the tenor promises to look for the reader in the audience the next time he is on stage--to the last of the 15

vivid synopses which roll along, *con brio*, in the present tense. Alongside the so-called ABC's-- *Aida*, *La Boheme* and *Carmen*--are less often performed works such as *L'Enfant et les Sortilèges*, *Porgy and Bess* and *The Love for Three Oranges*. The author skillfully refers to specific musical passages and uses dialogue drawn from the libretto to link each story to an actual performance. References to staging details, which vary with productions, are a less appropriate choice for inclusion. Although brief accounts in general cannot do justice to the deep emotion and psychological insight of *Pagliacci* or *The Magic Flute*, these failings are more than redeemed by Rosenberg's handsomely detailed watercolors, which convey the opulent sensuality of opera at its most sublime. I bought this book as a primer before taking my 6-year-old to "The Barber of Seville" - the first opera for both of us. The text is not the typical children's book made of large print and miniature paragraphs; rather, it reads at perhaps a middle-school level, telling the story of several operas. There are a few illustrations, but mostly text. After reading it to my daughter, I can honestly say that we both learned from this book. An accompanying CD would have been awesome (sigh)

This book was just too "cutesy," and overly detailed, both in text and illustrations, for my purposes. I've been going to the opera for decades, and I'm looking for a book of short, straightforward stories of operas, with simple, charming illustrations, that would introduce the operas to my young grandchildren. This book was overwhelming, and I sent it back.

It can be difficult these days to find books to read to your children that are both interesting to the child, and to the adult who is reading it! For those of you that are opera fans and want a way to introduce your little one to these masterpieces, this book does a fantastic job.
