


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# Darkening Of The Light: Witnessing The End Of An Era

The Darkening of the Light, I felt the truth of it. An instant recognition settled upon me, for Llewellyn Vaughan-Lee is describing here what I have also seen and experienced. He speaks of being ill and going into the world of light for some time. I was five years old when I experienced this world of endless white light. I was gravely ill with measles. Delirious on the physical level, I entered into the dimension that is endless white light, nothing but white light. Being there in this light restored something to my soul, which had become shadowed by the dysfunctional family situation and the tissues of lies woven around me. I think likely my soul would have decided to just leave this incarnation were it not for receiving a timeout in the dimension of white light. We need that light so desperately to nourish the soul, even as we need food and clean water to nourish our bodies. We can't remain in that world of white light too long, as Llewellyn says, but it can be transmitted through the veils between the dimensions in sufficient quantity to keep our soul growing and evolving. This is how it always was, that the Glory of God was transmitted to human beings, though perhaps through many veils. We read in Genesis how Adam and Eve walked with God in the cool of the evening. We hear how beings of light were received by Abraham and Isaac, by Mary and the shepherds. Paul was blinded by it on the road to Emmaus. The veils were there, but the separation from God was never extreme. Then something changed. As Llewellyn says, having seen it in visions, mankind began to make a wall, of something like bricks we mortared together, to separate ourselves from God. Veils may filter, but a wall obstructs. And a wall is no natural structure. Bricks have to be made one by one. They don't grow in field and forest! So this wall was constructed. It was built. It was fashioned deliberately, using the precious gift of free will we have been given by God. This is how it was used: to separate us from God. Now we live in the shadow of this wall, and it has denied us our God-given heritage of light. Is it any wonder that we wander about chaotically grasping at any straw of comfort, filled with anxiety and rage? What do these bricks consist of? Our power trips, our beliefs, our ideologies, our greeds, our inertia built higher and higher in every generation for hundreds, even thousands of years. We need to have, individually and collectively, what Socrates called an anagnorisis, a moment of true recognition, in which we see ourselves and our situation as we really are and it really is, not as all the sowers of lies and fantasies have painted it for us on the bricks of obstruction.

Llewellyn Vaughan-Lee is a powerful voice of mystic knowledge, and brings a spiritual focus to the ecological crisis. He's hitting on many historical points from a spiritual perspective, and impeccably! Just a few:- We are cut off from the source of existence. There is a source and we can connect it.
