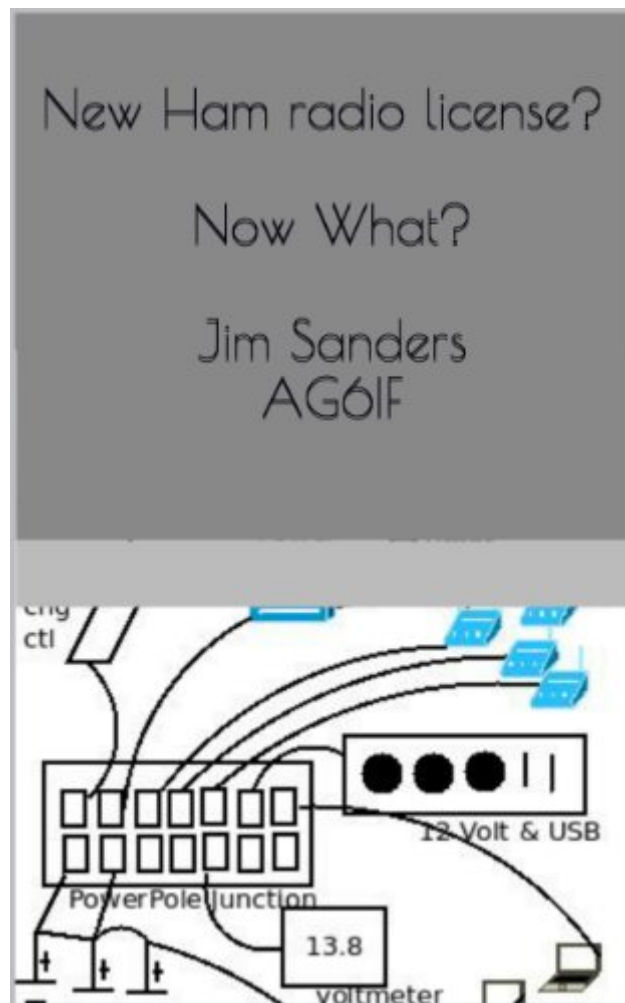

This little book is especially valuable as an adjunct to the ARRL's HT book "Radios To Go!" Sanders' book is down-to-earth and practical in its focus. You can think of it as a "Keep It Simple, Stupid" Elmer (experienced ham mentor) guiding you in selecting equipment and operating modes when you are just getting started with a Technician class license. While the ARRL book focuses exclusively on handheld radios, Sanders' book covers more options. The ARRL book only covers products and services advertised in ARRL properties, while Sanders covers popular products like the Baofeng HTs sold by and the excellent free Chirp programming software, as well as inexpensive roll-up J-pole antennas. However, Sanders' book is quite short and the formatting is

disappointing. You can not hyperlink from the Table of Contents to the chapter of interest. You can jump from the start of a chapter to the start of the next chapter, so one doesn't have to go page-by-page. Cheap and quick to read. Recommended.
