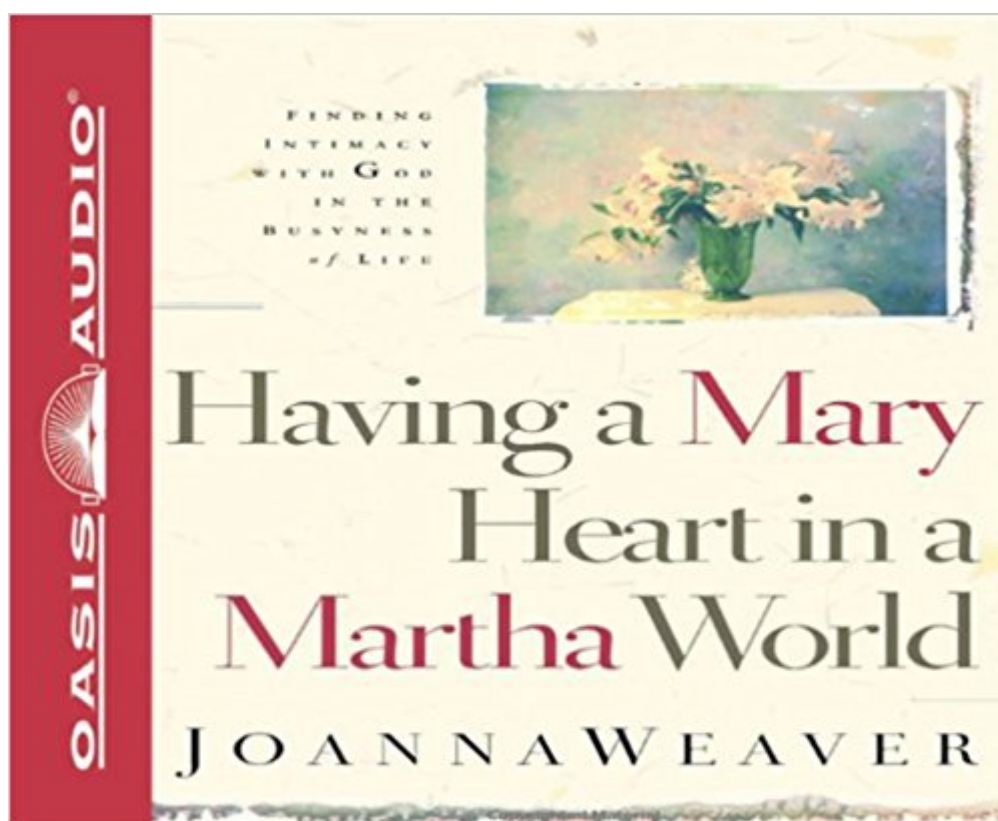

This is such a great book for all women to read.. Many of us fall under the same patterns that

Martha did, but in this world the Lord calls us to be more like Mary, sitting at the throne and allowing Him to pour into us and love us and mold us. I recommend this to any woman who is constantly on the go and feels the need to always be busy to feel validated; I know this is me many times.

This book is more than a guide to "Finding Intimacy With God in the Busyness of Life." I'd call it "A Woman's Introduction to Christian Living and Spiritual Disciplines." It covers the spiritual disciplines of Bible study, hospitality, prayer, and several others. At times, the analogies seemed a bit forced, and the messages are repeated over and over. But sometimes, I think we need that repetition to get things through our thick (or just tired) minds. I picked up *Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World: Finding Intimacy With God in the Busyness of Life* during a time when I was completely overwhelmed, but I didn't read it until a time when I was free from care. It's sad that when we're swamped, we feel like we lack the bandwidth to do what our souls really need.

This is a great book and will definitely lead to some life changes if you take it to heart. The author does an excellent job of taking you through her own personal journey. Doing so includes the reader and allows the reader to relate to her story and well as your own story. No wonder it is considered a best seller! I will be teaching from this book in an entire weeklong class (in a few weeks) and I can't wait!!! Great spiritual material with a well thought out message.

I adore the title of this book. It extrapolates on one of the most beloved New Testament passages when Martha, working herself harried in the kitchen to serve a bunch of men who have suddenly arrived and expect refreshments, finds her sister, Mary, sitting at the feet of Jesus, listening rapt to his teaching. Martha is upset and asks Jesus to tell Mary to get up and help her! Now! But Jesus says no. Mary "has the better part." So the question author Joanna Weaver wrestles with is how to have a Mary heart (mature spirituality and the time for God each day) in a Martha world (where job, husband, kids and activities vie for your time). The book is quite readable, well organized with interesting stories intermixed with theology. Since I come from a mainline Protestant denomination, I had some trouble (OK, at times a lot of trouble) with the strong--almost passionate--evangelical point of view that dominates this book. It felt alienating, and for this reason I give it three stars. One note: I found--and reported to , since I was reading this on a Kindle--38 punctuation errors, mostly missing or misplaced apostrophes.

Being very new to Bible reading and studying I did find myself challenged at times. Part of the

challenge was honestly answering the questions in the study section. In this book and study guide I was inspired to take a closer look at my spiritual walk and purpose.

Life-changing! Read this book with a group of friends. We are all in our late 20's and it had such a profound impact on our lives. It was challenging, comforting, affirming and inspiring. I've bought several copies for most of the women in my family both young and old. I am so grateful that Joanna Weaver was obedient and completed this book! "Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World" is a wonderful book to read alone or with a group study. There is a very good DVD study and study guide that accompanies this book if desired. Joanna Weaver does a great job showing how the busyness of the world around us can pull us away from truly being in God's presence, even if it seems we are doing things we think will please Him. She states, "When we put work before worship, we put the cart before the horse," and "When we first spend time in His presence--when we take time to hear His voice--God provides the horsepower we need to pull the heaviest load." We all need to choose the better part and spend time out of the kitchen and in the living room, sitting at the feet of Jesus.
