The biggest takeaway for me was the analogy that 401ks and IRAs are like "vehicles" for your investments, not actual investments. Simple info. If that sounds ridiculously obvious-then this book is too beginner for you. I am probably the perfect person for this type of book. Zero knowledge and basically uncomfortable with money/numbers in general. This book is simple, straight forward with a casual approach. I like how it is broken into days so I didn't feel guilty reading only a few pages a time and it kept me from overwhelming myself. Obviously a lot of details are left out and when I

actually went to look at my current 401k info, it used none of the same verbiage that was used in the book. Little frustrating but this is just a very beginner starting point and between the simplified book info and google I was able to make sense of things better.

Pretty basic stuff. Not a lot of practical guidance - but it was only \$0.99 I thought I would give it a shot. I am a big fan of YNAB and this does not change that. I can see where this would be a valuable introduction to someone not familiar at all with investing to get started.

I take in practice all the advises, I'm in Peru so we don't have enough finance tools but with a little bit of research I made invest in funds and bonds and everything is automatic I only review the states monthly and put more money, it's all, and be patient, thank you for your help,

The author gives a watered down version of how to invest. His humor helped me get through the reading but luckily I found his information informative. This is a great book for gaining a simple and straightforward understanding of investing. Where so many other books tend to get way too technical, or have a length that is prohibitive, this one is intentionally kept simple and easy to understand, thereby providing an entry into investing that is accessible to everyone...especially those not possessing an accounting degree. I'd highly recommend this to anyone and everyone, but especially to young adults just starting out on their own.

Jesse does a great job of writing as if you're sitting down for a cup of coffee with him. This quick read is lightweight and packed with simple advice for the beginner investor. I highly recommend it.

This book is definitely useful, but I found "A Beginner's Guide to Investing" to be more thoroughly researched. For example, Betterment is the only brokerage discussed in this book and basically nothing is written about the components of a balanced investment portfolio (other than to open a Betterment account). That said, I still like this book because it's a quick read, offers great information, and helped me feel a lot more confident about opening up a brokerage account right away (which definitely counts for a lot in my book). I think this book should be read in addition to at

least one other beginner's investment guide.
