

The science section was really disorienting to study for. Each section starts with a section of only sample questions and answers, and then another section to explain each topics you need to relearn to pass the test. But the way it explains everything in the science and history section is not clear, it will explain some some things about the topics but won't cover some of the information covered in the sample questions. This makes it hard to study for because you have to read the part that goes over everything in detail and then you have to refer back to sample questions to cover anything else that's not explained in the sections where it's supposed to explain everything you need to re learn. They need to organize the book better, explain everything better and have better picture w explanations, especially in the science and history sections.

This book is somewhat helpful but I found the domain review sections to be a difficult format to study. I ended up purchasing a different online video prep system and used the practice tests in this book as extra review. It is worth mentioning though that I have never liked test prep books for my studying,

Hello everyone. I passed all three subtests of the CSET on the first try (wooooo!). I read each page of this 500+ page study guide. When I left the testing center I felt that I failed each test miserably. When the results came back I scored a high percentage. This test is funky. Some of the questions will not make any sense. You will feel more than challenged even in your strongest subjects. As others mentioned, there are some bits of information that are missing from the book for the HISTORY section. Try additional sources like 'everything your 5/6th grader should know' to prepare for this part or any subject you are less confident in. CSET: You probably have to do it while enrolled in school full time, and working full time too. It's not fun, but we all need to do it to get the credential just heat up multiple cups of coffee, and power through it while juggling midterms and finals. I wish someone would have told me this information. Good luck!

After multiple attempts to pass the math and science portion of the CSET, I wanted to try a new study guide because clearly the one I had was not working for me. After studying that section for a few weeks, I finally PASSED!! Definitely recommend this one as a study guide!

These tests are notoriously hard to study for because the material is so broad. This book has pretty accurate tests that mimic the kinds of questions you'll get, but if you're hoping to LEARN the information from this book, you'll need another book in addition to this one. It's not bad, but the info in the "lessons" section of this book doesn't match the quizzes. So, if you think you can just read the lessons and be ready for the practice tests, that's not correct. It doesn't work like that. I found that if I treated the practice tests like a method of me learning the actual information, then I felt okay. But, I needed another book on top of this one to make sure I covered my bases. Last thing - the two in-book tests are pretty accurate, but the CR-ROM tests are REALLY hard. I don't know if this is on purpose, but the questions are very nuanced and specific. Overly so, actually. I took all my exams, and I felt like the CD tests were just not that helpful.

Use this book as a outline then use websites, textbooks, any extra resources to look up each header of this book, especially for history! I spent two weeks of nonstop studying(mainly history) and I took all three tests in one sitting and passed with high scores

I passed all three CSET Multiple Subjects tests using this book on my first try :) I took each subtest separately because studying for all three was too overwhelming for me. I took them each one month apart but studied for each one about one week prior. This book is separated into the three subtests and each one has a ton of great and concise information about the subjects. It also includes sample questions in each subject area along with reasoning. It ALSO includes practice tests, which were pretty similar to the actual Cset. I wasn't surprised by anything on the test after using this book but be sure you have a general understanding of each concept. I only used this study guide to study for the three subtests and I don't think I would have passed without them. I HIGHLY recommend this book.

Just found out I passed all three sections on the first try, so I am celebrating! But, I did it with this book. It contained almost all of the information I needed. The only section that I really had to expand upon was the history section. Each event that the book mentioned, I googled online to get more details, and then made my own outlines with all of the information (and I added a lot!). Just use that

section for what it is, an outline, and fill in the gaps yourself. Other than that, the book was really all I needed! Good luck!

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
