

I have the old version, but bought this to get the latest and greatest. Compared to the older version of this book the maps are in color and easier to read. Obviously they aren't going to rewrite every word, but I hoped with the new version to get the benefit of any changes they've made since the 2010 version. The new formatting at times is a bit hard to follow; to use Auray as an example, the town name is in bold but then there are sections below set off with large type that seem to be nearby smaller villages but apparently are areas within Auray itself.

A great guide, used it all the time on our 2016 trip to Normandy (planned to do Brittany as well, but ran out of time!). Highly recommend: intelligent, detailed, hits all the major cultural spots, provides decent background info. Easy to use.
