As I understand, this was a series of effects by top magicians of the day. Lou Tannen bought the series, compiled them into book form, published the book, and sold them from his magic shop in New York City. When I was in high school, I asked the librarian if she would order the book for the school, as I couldn't afford it. After months of waiting, it arrived! It was well worth the wait! Magic with cards, coins, cigarettes, handkerchiefs, and more... all by masters of the art that are now no

longer with us... but still fill the literature. Lots of pictures to make everything clear! Fantastic! The rights appear to have been sold to Paul Fried of D. Robbins, Inc., a wholesaler of magic, books, and novelties. Finally, the rights seem to have been purchased by Meir Yedid of MYMagic. He "cleaned up" the pictures making them sparkle as if they were taken yesterday! Folks... this is a classic treatise of great effects... not for the beginner, but certainly for intermediate and up magicians. You can't go wrong, plus it's a great introduction to yesterday's masters of magic!

This book is talked about all the time in the magic community and for good reason. The effects inside are easy to adapt to "modern" settings. They require a lot of time to put the words into actions but will give so much more than you have to put into it. If you want to learn good magic this is a great place to find it. I would recommend getting some basic coin and card books as well to speed up the learning process.

This was a replacement for the copy I had had for many years. I loaned it out and never got it back. It has so many excellent sleight-of-hand tricks that it's worth the replacement cost. It is such a good book that I replaced it at about the same cost as the original, bought at least thirty years ago.
