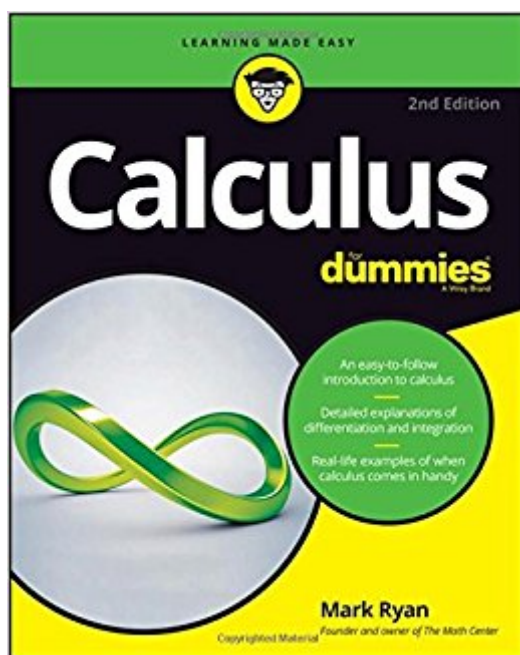


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Calculus For Dummies (For Dummies (Lifestyle))

However, one thing I HATE in textbooks is when it is written "refer to figure x" and figure x is on a page before or after the material you're reading which requires you to flip back and fourth between the pictorial and the information. As a visual learner this is very frustrating. I'm only in chapter 3 and this has already happened about a handful of times. EDIT: As I go on with this text, I've decided to bump the review up a notch because the paper is very nice. It's refreshing to get real paper you can actually highlight on again after getting so many textbooks with glossy paper that really do not like to be written in.

This is the best Dummies book I've bought. The author is a genius. He really explains the concepts very well and clear enough.
