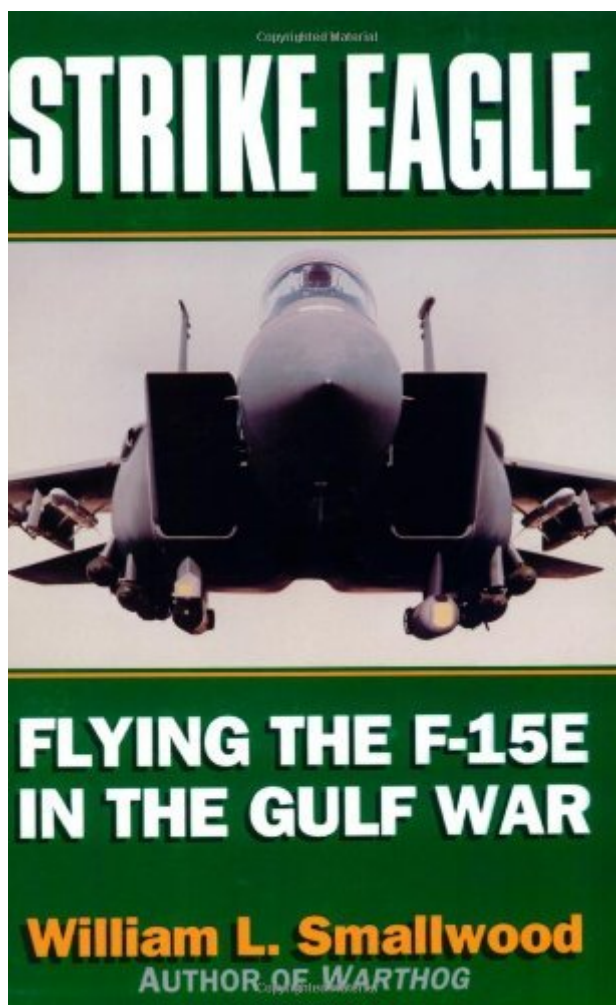

Some of the stories told were eye-opening. they helped open my eyes not just to the life of the F-15E pilots and wso's, but also to the political nature of the war. I feel the political nature of this conflict is something important to understand for those who are trying to understand what participated in the conflict and why. however, i feel the author did not focus on the history of the F-15E enough. granted, the title of this book is "Flying the F-15E in the Gulf War." so i understand why he wrote what he wrote. however, i felt he had an incredible opportunity to help the layperson understand where and why the F-15E came to being. that addition probably would have added a chapter to the book, but throughout the book, i just kept thinking it would have been a very welcomed addition. however, this book was a very important part of my gulf war library and one that i do not, for one second, regret taking the time to read. This book covers a part of the war that, in the pilot's view, that was badly underrepresented. And now, after reading, i would most definitely have to agree.

Overall a good read if you like this sort of book. Lots about attack aircraft tactics and practical concerns. Some excitement, trivia and tragedy to make it stand out.
