

Beautiful Girl is a book that explores the darker corners of young adults in their earliest years of independent living - set at a very competitive private school on the east coast. A note to future readers - some people come into their college experience full of confidence and never have an issue joining into the frat party and mainstream crowd so many of us remember as the "fun college days". Some of those readers, with their effortless entry into the social soup of college and only good memories, may not entirely understand the characters within Beautiful Girl and the very personal battles they face (internal and external) in this book. However, for the rest of us, this is an all-to-real roller coaster for people who have lived through the experience of overcoming the hurdles of eating disorders, mental disorders, rape, and drug use/abuse - all to finally face the demons and stand victorious with self-esteem intact. Anyone who has faced similar demons, or has been the trusted friend of someone who has faced these challenges, will cheer for Nicole as she navigates so many tricky situations and assaults coming from roommates, boyfriends, and herself.

The book "Beautiful Girl" was a great story what i liked the most about this book was the ending wheni found out who has been threatening Nicole. It was a bit confusing in the beginnning of the story, when the narrator "Nicole" was describing her campus. The only character i really liked from the story is Henry, because he is a very generous, sweet, and loving guy. It's a triumphant, uplifting story. And a beautiful story. Told by a wise and truly beautiful narrator. Highly recommended for teens and their moms (who need to be reminded sometimes how hard it all was back then, before you knew exactly who you were.)

Twists and turns and suspense in the action, but also exploration of the mental stress of an intense college experience. The main character, Nicole, tries to deal with and recover from her own problems while living in a world of kids also brought with struggles and challenges: men, body image issues, drugs... exes, grades/course work. She uses running, among other things, as an escape, but is eventually forced to face the dark memories in her past that keep pushing her to extremes and self destruction.

I finished reading this two days ago and I went to write this review and I could not remember the book. That is how unimpressed I am. I felt like I had walked into a movie that had started 30 minutes earlier. So many of the relationships between characters were not explained or clarified. Readers are expected to be able to know them, their motivations and have compassion for them. Sorry, no compassion here. I didn't care what happened to each character. The characters in this story were weird and 1 dimensional. I don't like to trash any book, I really admire people who write, but this one was tough.

I really had a hard time connecting with this one. I wasn't a fan of any of the characters and I really didn't get it. The book was about a lot of different things, but none of it pulled together for me. There was bulimia, rape, attacks, drug use, and a main character that is so confused about life, that it all just didn't translate well for me. The writing was good, well edited and this wouldn't stop me from reading one of her other books, I just didn't love it.

I LOVED the main character in Beautiful Girl, her dark thoughts and outlook, and strong sense of self. The sense of place in this novel is very clear and compelling. Lida James paints such clear pictures of the varied emotional connections Nicole has with the other characters so you're drawn to either love them or hate them -- no in between. Highly recommend!
